

Hemlandsnytt

News from the homeland

A column of current Swedish news topics, taken from Swedish news media. They do not reflect the opinions of the Swedish Cultural Center.

Big: Swedish construction company Skanska is expected to be awarded a contract for building an extension to the subway in New York City. The order is worth \$400 million, according to a press release.

No deal: Ford is now in reverse as CEO Alan Mulally has announced that, contrary to initial beliefs: "Volvo is not for sale". Ford is presently negotiating the sales of Jaguar and Landrover. Mr. Mulally said that Ford really could have sold Volvo, but that they decided to keep it.

Accepted: Astra Zeneka has received a green light to introduce the cholesterol lowering drug Crestor in the USA. This will give Crestor an advantage over Liptor and Vytorin. FDA approved Crestor to help curb the development of Atherosclerosis (hardening of the arteries) in adults.

Victory: The oyster chucking champion of the World lives in Göteborg. Chef Hasse Johannesson recently won the gold at the World Oyster Chucking Championships before more than 10,000 spectators at the city of Galway, Ireland. Johannesson opened 30 oysters in two minutes and 41 seconds. The silver medal went to a Canadian who was 13 seconds behind Johannesson and the bronze went to Norway.

Moose story: Moose hunter Sven-Erik Rådlund, from Ljusdal, was looking for the moose he just had shot and wounded. He found the big bull lying down and felt it would be safe to move closer to him. About ten feet from the moose, the hunter began to leash his dog when the moose rose and charged, pinning the helpless hunter to the ground. During the hullabaloo, the hunter's shotgun ended up beside him, however, and when one when of the bull's hooves landed on the gun a shot went off, scaring away the animal, who soon died from the wounds. This story could have ended with "Moose shooting hunter".

More moose: Another moose, a cow, wanted to get clean and she managed to get into a swimming pool filled with water. Sadly she couldn't get back out so the pool owner called the rescue patrol who, after draining out the water, built wooden steps for the moose to climb on and get out. Didn't work so she was tranquilized and lifted out.

Speeding: An off-duty cop was met by a somewhat strange sight on State Road 50 going south towards Örebro. While a car towing another car is not so unusual, the speed at which these two cars were moving was a different story. As the policeman followed the cars, he clocked their speed at about 100 kmh (60 mph) – the speed limit for towing is 30 kmh (19 mph). Once stopped, the two drivers lost their licenses on the spot. Ironically, both will also be charged with reckless driving.
