## Finish Film Series in November

The November 28 entry in the "Films from Finland" series is "Helmiä ja sikoja (Pearls and Pigs)". "Helmiä" is Perttu Leppä's 2003 comedy about the efforts of four down-and-out sons of a jailed bootlegging father to pay off some debts he left. When a nine-year-old half-sister unexpectedly shows up on their doorstep, her singing talent offers the possibility of winning a national television competition and wiping out the debt with the prize money...but not everything runs according to plan.

As is the case with all films in this fourth Wednesday series, this one begins at 7:30 p.m. at the Swedish Cultural Center. A \$5.00 donation is requested at the door. The film is in Finnish, with English subtitles, and clocks in at 106 minutes. While rated K-11, there is language, alcohol use and nudity that some may find offensive.

The final selection in the 2007 "Films from Finland" is Audience Choice. That means that anyone may suggest a film for the December 26 showing. ## Hemlandsnytt

News from the homeland

A column of current Swedish news topics, taken from Swedish news media. They do not reflect the opinions of the Swedish Cultural Center.

**New record:** No Swedes have seen so many days dawn as Astrid Zachrison in Holsby Brunn, outside Vetlanda. Zachrison recent turned 112 years and 144 days old. She had seen 26 Swedish prime ministers and four kings come and go — passing up Elsa Moberg from Lysekil, who was 112 years and 143 days when she passed away in 2001.

**Never:** Crown Princess Victoria refuses to wear a fur coat for ethical reasons and for the same reason she doesn't participate in hunting of animals...despite the fact that she does have a hunting license.

**Hanging in:** Companies in Sweden are staying competitive, according to Prime Minister Fredrik Reinfeldt. The Krona has jumped this year to its strongest level against the dollar since late 1995, thanks, in part, to a series of interest rate increases by the independent Riksbank.

**Voting:** The first referendum among Sames (Lapplanders) is on its way. The Same organization "Same Ätnam" will hold a public voting among the Sames about where their parliament building will be built (it will likely be either Kiruna or Arvidsjaur).

**Top level visit:** Former president Bill Clinton drew quite a crowd on the Avenue in Göteborg when he signed his new book at Wettergren's book store. There was a huge force of police, secret service and press and the folks lining up to get their copies had to leave their bags and other things in a special wardrobe tent outside the store for security reasons.

**SAAB:** The all-purpose jet fighter SAAB 39 Gripen is becoming a very attractive aircraft for foreign countries and India has requested that the company build 108 of the aircraft, at a value of SEK 60 billion (\$ 8.8 billion) at their plant in Linköping. Several companies were competing for the order which is the largest within the aircraft industry since the early 1990's. India eventually wants to purchase a total of 300 combat aircraft.

**Flower tale:** Forced to steal her own bridal bouquet, necessity knew no law for the bride to be, Camilla Andersson, from Umeå. The flower shop supplying Camilla's bridal boquet was supposed to open extra early, but something went awry. A half hour after the promised pick-up time, Camilla decided to take the law in her own hands: she crawled under a barred gate, into the store and fetched the bouquet, which was placed in a closet — then she took off for the church. No police showed up and now her last name is Holmström.
